

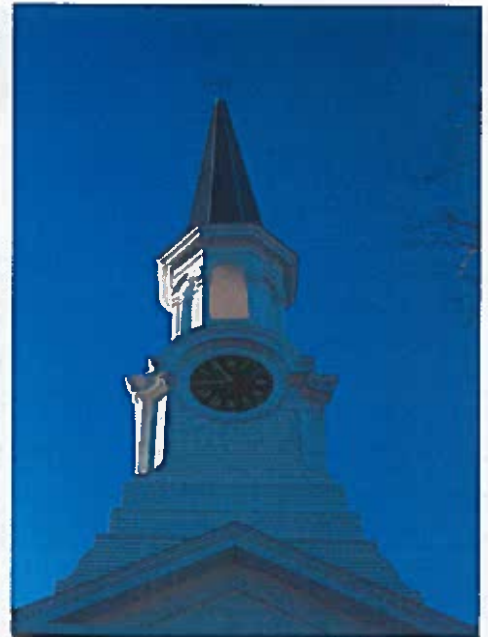

## Trustees Update

### **Buildings and Grounds:**

James Stevens will be working on the bulkhead doors and adding a door to the Sanctuary basement. He will also place a support jack in the Sanctuary basement for added floor support.

The Parsonage bathroom renovation and miscellaneous project work are complete.

James Stevens will do minor outdoor repairs this summer at the Parsonage. Repairs to be done – basement windows repaired, replace window in shed, lattice work around porch replaced and replace porch steps using the material used on the Parsonage's front steps.

The steeple and church painting were budgeted at \$20,000. MMR Steeplejack quoted \$15,000 for the job. The lift will be \$3,800. Pacific North's painting quote is \$6,250. This puts us over budget on this project by about \$5,000. It was agreed to proceed with the project –knowing it will be over budget and expecting other projects to come in under budget to make up the difference. It was also agreed that eaves painting at the parsonage should be done this year while we have the lift.

New Chapel carpet is scheduled for installation in mid-June. Cost was \$6,000 (includes installation, etc.) and purchased from Harmony Home Décor. Larry & Jenny painted the chapel prior to the new carpet installation.

Our prayer shawls are created with this prayer, given in card form to each recipient:

May you awaken each morning  
filled with the light and the joy of the Holy Spirit  
And retire each night comforted and cradled  
in the knowing of God's love now and for all time

The basic knit pattern:

555 yards; cast on 57 stitches  
begin every row with k3, p3 to end

The basic crochet pattern:

740 yards; chain 54 stitches or desired width of shawl  
Chain 1, turn, single crochet in each of the stitches to end.  
Chain 3 and turn.  
Double crochet in top of each single crochet.  
Repeat this row 2 more times.  
Chain 1 and do 1 row of single crochet to end. Chain 3 and turn.  
Do 3 rows of double crochet. Repeat pattern to end (1 row single, 3 rows double) End with 1 row of single
