"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—

not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." Ephesians 2:8-10 NIV

This passage from Paul's letter to the church in Ephesus speaks to the nature of salvation, divine grace, and the wonder present in all creation. I love the translation here- from the New International Versionwhere Paul refers to humanity as "God's handiwork" because it's such a lovely image! God has shaped each of us exactly how we are meant to be, and that is so good and reassuring for all of us. The New Revised Standard Version of the Bible translates the same passage as "...for we are what he has made us..." which speaks to the same idea, though perhaps with a slightly more formal tone. Each one of us is formed by God with unique aifts, attributes, quirks, and ways of being; and it's all good because it all comes from God.

This passage was one of the scriptures offered in the service where we welcomed our six confirmands into church membership on March 3rd and I think it speaks well to the unique spirit of each of them. Each confirmand brought their own gifts to our classes, raised their own questions, explored their own theology, and shared their own spirit with each other; now, all of those gifts are parts of our church community, shared with all the other unique gifts each person offers for the betterment of the whole. All of these

gifts, woven together, create a beautiful tapestry of God's handiwork which tells the story of our community of faith, our church.

As I have begun to settle into (nearly) fulltime pastor's hours, I've had the chance to connect with more and more of you in different ways, and I have found that same spirit of God's unique handiwork reflected in those connections. Some of you prefer to call me on the phone, some feel more comfortable with an email interaction. others love to text or send a Facebook message, and these are all great ways for us to be in touch! I delight in a note left on my desk or slid under the door too, but my favorite way to connect with you all is face to face, and my intent is to make more regular time for that in my schedule. No matter how you do it, though, I hope that we connect soon, and often!

On March 10th, we had our first Pastor Chat after the service, and we enjoyed a variety of conversation in a small group (about 8 people). I feel that discussion in small groups is a vital part of our church conversation, so we will offer more opportunities to chat going forward. Look for information on our next Pastor Chat to be held on Zoom on Wednesday, April 3rd! Going forward, I will also have open office hours 10-11am on Tuesday and Thursday morning. No appointment is necessary, just drop by for a quick chat at any point in that hour! If you need more time to talk or need to speak confidentially, just let me know and we can make an appointment to meet any time it's convenient.

As far as the pastoral transition goes, Pastor Steve and I are deep in it! Worship services have been coordinated between the two of us into August, and we will continue to remain in close contact throughout this transition which ends with my graduation

from seminary in May 2025. So far, all is working well in this transition process, and good communication between both pastors and the church will ensure that things continue to operate smoothly. Though this arrangement is a bit unconventional, it seems like it also serves the pastors and the community in a healthy and supportive way that encourages growth.

Communication and discussion are key to this transition being successful, and as congregational people this is the typical way in which we operate. We worship as a congregation, meet as a congregation... we break bread together, sing together, laugh together... we share each other's joy and pain that comes as a part of life. Let's keep on talking to and with each other as well, with the prayer that we may deepen our understanding as a community of followers of Christ; that we continue to be people of both faith and mission, serving our community and our world as Jesus has called us. May we always remember that we are God's handiwork, fearfully and wonderfully made, and that there is always grace in abundance.

Pastor Steve

By the time you read this I will have completed and fulfilled (hopefully) my call to the DFCC as your Designated Term Pastor. It was up on March 31, Easter Sunday. Now Jill and I are living full-time in our retirement home in Winthrop. While my contract has expired, I am still going to be with you off and on for a while. However, my role has changed and I now serve in support of Rachel as she transitions into being your full-time licensed pastor and becoming your ordained minister. This is an exciting path for all of you and for Rachel.

So, again, I want to repeat the details of how we see all this playing out.

As of April 1, I am on a two month sabbatical and Rachel will solo as pastor until June. Early June, Rachel and I will overlap for a week before she heads off to Halifax for her last summer session at AST. I'll take over pastoral responsibilities through Sunday August 4.

August 5, Rachel returns and will be settling into the parsonage. She will be full time at that point, serving as your licensed minister until she is ordained and installed at DFCC. The hope is for that to happen in summer of 2025, but a final date depends on completion of the MID process (pathway to ordination) with the Katahdin Association and its Committee on Ministry.

Until then, I remain available to you on an as-needed basis. Once Rachel's schedule and seminary demands become clear for

late 2024 and into 2025, we'll pencil in the other times when I will fill in.

So, this is a transition time, not an abrupt ending/beginning. Nevertheless, things will be different. Rachel Dobbs is THE Pastor of the DFCC and will be your pastor for the foreseeable future. It's a good story, how that all unfolded. I congratulate all of you for the choices you have made and for the optimism and enthusiasm that are leading you onward. The Spirit is good here. You have vision that is open and bold enough to "take roads less travelled." You have determination to do the good works of faith with grace for our times, in service to our neighbors and future generations. I know all that language sounds a little extravagant and rhetorical, but I can give examples. I'll take that into account down the road that remains for us and fill in with some details.

For now, may it suffice to say that I am fortunate to have been called by you in 2017 to serve as your interim minister and then your designated term pastor. It has been a time filled with seriously relevant ministry by a church community that looks at the way things are and asks what can we be and do better for the good of others around us and those who will come after us. A promising beginning, in my opinion, for a church entering its 3rd century. Glad I've been here to see it!


